## **Health Inspections/Brand Inspections**

### **HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR WYOMING**

All horses entering Wyoming are required to have a current certificate of veterinary health inspection (COVHI) from point of origin dated within 30 days of arrival at the Central Wyoming Fairgrounds and a Negative equine infectious anemia (EIA/COGGINS) test. Result of the coggins test cannot be over 12 months old. EIA test results may be noted on the COVHI by reference of the accession number. **NO PENDING COGGINS WILL BE ACCEPTED.** Failure to follow these guidelines could result in a \$210.00 fine.

Goats need health inspections from point of origin dated within 30 days of arrival to Wyoming.

### **BRAND INSPECTION REQUIREMENTS**

Wyoming law requires any horse traveling the state to have proper, current papers from the state of origin. Anyone hauling livestock in the state of Wyoming without the proper papers is subject to a fine.

If the state of origin is without brand laws, current health papers will fulfill this requirement. If the state of origin has brand laws, current health papers plus proper brand inspection forms are required.

Horses will be inspected upon arrival at the Casper fairgrounds by Wyoming brand inspectors. Wyoming A forms will be issued at that time for a fee's per horse.

**BRAND INSPECTORS WILL BE AVAILABLE FROM 8:00 a.m. TO 9:00 p.m. Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday, June 10th through 13th at the rodeo office at the fairgrounds.** If you arrive after 9:00 p.m. or before 8:00 a.m. committee members will be present to check you in, give stall assignments, but you will be required to bring you animals and papers back to rodeo office for health and brand inspections.

**All animals are required to check in at the rodeo office at the fairgrounds.**
